Of course, he was only too pleased to oblige however owing to covid restrictions she could not easily pick them up. As Margaret and I were able to go to the Home, we were able to deliver the books to the Pharmacist much to her delight and Eddie's relief.

It was Eddie's passion and obvious enjoyment imparting his story to others which endeared him to us and everyone who met him. His message is timeless, and his memory will live long in the world well beyond the Jewish people.
